COVID-19 PROTOCOL - SYMPTOMS & TESTING

- If a student has one of the symptoms listed below, he must stay home.
- If a student has one low risk symptom that resolves in 24-48 hours, he can return to school when he has been free of that symptom for 24 hours and fever free without fever reducing medicine.
- If he has a high risk symptom or two low risk symptoms, he must be evaluated by his healthcare provider and given written clearance prior to school re-entry.
- If a student has been exposed to someone with COVID-19, he must not return to school until 14 days after the last day he was exposed to the positive person and have clearance from St. Louis County Department of Health if a St. Louis County resident, or a letter from his physician if he is not a St. Louis County resident
- If a student tests positive for COVID-19, he must stay home for 10-14 days after his symptom onset, must be without a fever for 24 hours, without fever reducing medicine, and have improved symptoms. If he had no symptoms, he can return 10 days from the date of his positive test. Also, he must be released by the County Health Department for St. Louis County residents or by his primary care provider for non-St. Louis County Residents.
- If a student has a sibling or parent diagnosed with COVID-19, the student cannot attend school for 14 days after the last day he was exposed to the positive person and have clearance from St. Louis County Department of Health if a St. Louis County resident, or a letter from his physician if he is not a St. Louis County resident.

High Risk Symptoms

- Cough
- Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell

Low Risk Symptoms

- Fever/chills
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Sore throat
- Runny nose/congestion
- Nausea/vomiting/diarrhea
